All of us at TCI would like to thank our parents and community supporters for all you do to help provide our students with the best 21st century learning opportunities. We appreciate our many parents who dedicate their time to work with students weekly during Enrichment, and our community and business partners who mentor students and provide weekly opportunities for students to explore interests in club day.

We have many great opportunities lined up for students this semester at TCI. Tri-County Schools understand the great benefits and outcomes STEM education brings to our students, and we are working together to enhance our STEM programming across all of our schools.



All students are immersed in STEM within each subject in the classrooms and attend our STEM Academy weekly. Thanks to Mrs. Ewen, students utilized our butterfly gardens provided by Bayer (formerly Monsanto) to observe the life cycle and tag butterflies for monitoring migration to Mexico. This year we have four robotics teams who will be competing in several competitions this year. All students are involved in one of twenty different clubs this year to explore their interests and be provided real-world application. Each club includes a 6th grade leader and staff or community sponsor. We are currently working with Purdue University on a grant partnership for acquiring hydroponics systems in our building. Purdue is currently building a system for each grade to get started, and through the grant students will be included in research at Purdue to determine larger scale hydroponics systems to be built at TCI.

Thank you to everyone involved in making all of these experiences possible for our students, and we welcome you to come see for yourself!

Welcome to the second semester of the school year! Tri-County Jr/Sr High School has accomplished much in the first part of the school year and is eager to keep the momentum going into the second semester.

The district was notified recently that we were awarded a \$30,000 planning grant through North Central Health Services to engage in the evaluation of programs and supports for students in the area of social-emotional needs and substance use/abuse. We look forward to learning additional ways in which we can support our students throughout the district by evaluating evidence based programs and engaging in rich dialogue with mental health professionals. Teams of teachers and administrators will be participating in regional and national conferences as well in order to learn effective and research based strategies to help all students.

Tri-County Jr/Sr High School has been working to increase the percentage of our students who are involved in co-curricular and extra-curricular organizations and school clubs. Last year, roughly 80% of our students were involved in one or more of these organizations. This year, our numbers have increased to approximately 83% of our student body being involved. We know that for students to be successful in school, we must get them involved. We hope YOU will be involved in our school by attending school events, asking your child about school, checking grades in PowerSchool and showing an interest in your child's academic progress. Working together, students thrive!

The Junior/Senior High School has been undergoing several facilities improvements over the past few months. Most noticeably are new student lockers, band area lockers, carpet and paint, AC/cooling tower, Agriculture Education shop improvements and the pool area. We are very appreciative of these improvements and the opportunities they provide our students!

Parents of 2019 graduates are reminded that graduation commencement exercises will be held on Sunday, June 2nd at 2:00pm at Tri-County High School. The date of graduation has been moved to June 2nd due to the ending date of school and forecasted inclement weather which will/could impact the end of the school year.
