Parent/Teacher Conferences

Parent/teacher conferences will be held on October 15th from 1-8 pm at the Jr/Sr High School. This will be a remote learning day for our students; students will not be at school this day. Parents will have the option of meeting with teachers in-person or having a virtual or phone conference. Information will be sent out to families to set a conference time.

TCP is Peanut Free

TCP continues to be a peanut free school. All classroom snacks, birthday treats, and student lunches from home need to be peanut free. Before you send an item to school, please read any food labels to see if any peanut product is an ingredient. Food products with labels that say "may contain peanuts" or "manufactured in a facility that processes peanuts" should stay at home since we cannot be sure it does not contain peanuts. If there are any questions about a certain item, do not hesitate to call our office for clarification.

Masks and Water Bottles

Two safety measures we are taking for our students are the water spout function of our drinking fountains and asking students to have a face mask. Our drinking fountains have a bottle filling station, so we ask that students bring a refillable bottle to school each day to use. Masks are necessary for times when social distancing is not possible and for riding the bus. While our students do not wear them all day, we do ask that each child bring a mask to school.

Recently, I was sucked into binge-watching YouTube videos. For me, my vice is old basketball videos. 
