## **Nurse's Notes Spring 2019**

It is hard to believe that the year is winding down. It has really flown by pretty quickly. The difficult winter has made us all anxious for spring to arrive!

With spring we find ourselves looking toward next year. Therefore, we must also look at immunizations that are needed **BEFORE** school starts in the fall. We will be sending letters soon to incoming Kindergarteners, 6th graders and Seniors. Each of those grades have state requirements for certain immunizations. The most important one is for the seniors. **ALL** incoming Seniors must have 2 - Hepatitis "A" doses. **\*\*Those doses are 6 months apart\*\***. Some students already have the immunizations that are required, so only those needing anything will receive a letter.

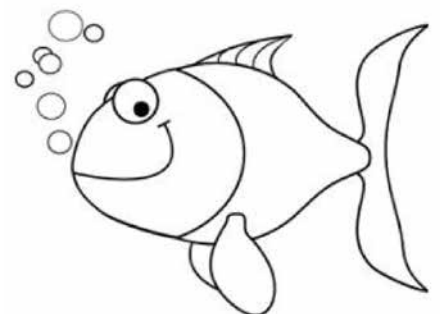

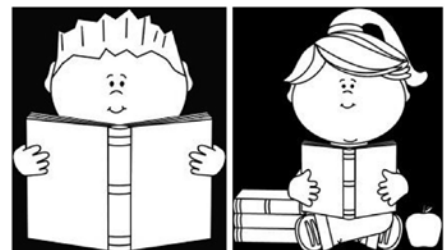
Don't let your child slide academically during the summer. Bring them to the library. We have lots of activities to help prevent the summer slide.

## ***From the Superintendent***

I recently enjoyed a sermon entitled the “The Bottom of the Ninth.” Using the 1992 Atlanta Braves and the National League Championship Series as a metaphor, the sermon attempted to demonstrate the notion, you may be down, but you are not out. Remember, the Braves were behind 2-0 entering the bottom of the ninth, needing 3 runs to win the game. The Braves had scored one run before Francisco Cabrera’s base hit scored the tying and winning run. The Braves scored 2 runs in the bottom of the ninth to win the game and go to the World Series. No matter the situation, whether in the classroom or in life, you may be down, but you are not out.

As a sports fan, I can only imagine the excitement and electricity in the stadium at that moment. I am sure for any fan present at the game that night, the memory is life-long. How awesome would it be to claim you were in the stadium on that October night to witness one of the most memorable moments in baseball history? That moment would be something to share with kids and grandkids for the rest of your life!!

During my research of the 1992 NLCS game 7, I read several reports about fans leaving the stadium prior to the bottom of the ninth. With the game entering the bottom of the ninth, and the outcome not looking positive for the home team, fans left the stadium in order to either not witness the Braves lose first hand, or beat the traffic.

If you were one of the reported fans who left early, what would be your reaction when you wake up the next morning to read about the home team making an epic comeback and winning the game? Fans left the game missing a rally still being discussed, replayed, and a part of baseball lore today.

When we encounter bottom of the ninth moments, how do we react? Are we similar to fans leaving the stadium early because we do not want to witness the result? Beat the traffic? Disgusted? No matter what circumstances we encounter, people react to bottom of the ninth moments differently.

In life, I believe we miss bottom of the ninth rallies for several reasons. During the course of the school year, staff and students will encounter moments that will test one’s resolve and fortitude. Our response to those bottom of the ninth moments should be marked with extraordinary compassion, generosity, and kindness. Quite honestly, our reputation as individuals rest on how we respond to these bottom of the ninth moments.
