The Tri-County School Board met for their Regular meeting on Monday, March 9, 2020. The following topics were covered:

1. Mrs. Tracy Zarse announced the Students of the Month Callie Ulm, Owen Wealing

Mr. Hagan and Ms. Sharon Foster announced the Students of the Month Makenzie Schwartz, Peyton Demerly

Mr. McCracken announced the Students of the Month Junior High School – Bella Dominguez, Trinity Miller High School – Levi Blume

- 2. Under the Reach Higher Showcase, Mr. Jeremy Sterk, Musical Director, introduced 7 cast members that performed a song from the Spring Musical, James and the Giant Peach. - 3. Mr. Hagan wanted to thank the PTO and the community for all of their hard work and participation for another very successful carnival. The IREAD tests are scheduled for next Tuesday. Mr. McCracken reported to the Board that every month the Junior High teachers meet during CAV Time and the 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> grade students report to the gym with Mr. McCracken and they sometime watch videos or do something constructive.
